## ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS

## 1. Introduction

Research projects that involve human participants either directly (e.g. being interviewed, answering questionnaires) and/or indirectly (e.g. accessing personal data) should be ethically reviewed by KUERC.

- 2. Qualitative based research projects that require ethical approval may include:
- i. Personal interviews
- ii. Ouestionnaires
- iii. Interviews
- iv. Focus groups
- v. Observation of groups etc
  - 3. Quantitative and experimental researches that require ethical approval may include:
- i. Questionnaires
- ii. Surveys,
- iii. Trials etc
  - 4. In addition all other research involving the following will require ethical clearance
  - Non-human animal subjects (Please seek ethical approval for research involving animals)
  - If you anticipate that the research project to expose any person, whether or not a participant, to physical or psychological harm
  - If you will have access to personal information that allows you to identify individuals or to confidential corporate or company information
  - If the research project may present a significant risk to the environment or society
  - 5. The ERC will evaluate the protocol under the following areas
    - i. Scientific design and conduct of study,
    - ii. Recruitment of research participant,
    - iii. Care and protection of research participants
    - iv. Protection of research participant's confidentiality,
    - v. Informed consent process,
    - vi. Community considerations.
